

CEAL 2010 Business Meeting  
Philadelphia Marriott Downtown  
Wednesday, March 24, 2010, 3:30-4:00 PM

CEAL President Kristina Troost opened the meeting by welcoming attendees and new CEAL members. She then made some general remarks regarding the two online elections held prior to the meeting. She noted that, despite the relatively short voting period allotted for the second election, the voter turnout for it was slightly greater than it was for the first. She expressed her appreciation to the nominating committee for its diligent efforts in seeking members to run for the various positions. She also encouraged everyone to consider volunteering to run for such positions in the future. Next, Troost asked Nominating Committee Chair Yasuko Makino to report on the election results.

Makino thanked fellow committee members Yunah Sung and Cathy Chiu for their service and Wooseob Jeong for programming the ballot. Makino reported that even when nominations were plentiful, it was hard to get people to agree to serve.

Makino provided the following information about the elections.

In the election for membership committee chair and member-at-large with Korean Studies focus, 83 of 175 eligible voters, or 47%, voted. In the election for vice president and general member-at-large, 93 of 177 eligible voters, or 52%, voted.
