The participants exchanged the following ideas about how to help the new comers to actively engage in the CEAL community and the East Asian librarianship: sending an individual email invitation to the Membership program, organizing a new member round table facilitated by 2-3 experienced librarians, and advocating the Mentorship program.

▪ **Membership Promotion**

Membership Promotion activities have been a part of the annual committee program at least last four years, and the committee follow the same path this year as well. This year's rep. for Membership Promotion presented "How can we help?: exchange information and ideas about how we can help the damaged Japanese cultural records by the earthquake." Below are minutes prepared by Ms. Kazuko Hioki, the host for the program.

As a part of CEAL Membership committee program, this round table was originally scheduled on March 30 4:00-5:50 pm, for the purpose of exchanging information and ideas on how to relief the situation where many Japanese cultural records were damaged by the earthquake and tsumami. The session started as scheduled, however, due to the conflict with NCC program, we had lower attendants than expected. Therefore, we decided to change the schedule after the NCC panel on April 1, 1-2 pm. This alternative arrangement was informed to both original attendees and prospective attendees by Ms. Hioki and Ms. Nakano.

During the NCC's panel session, Ms. Hioki briefly presented, to more than fifty attendees, about the latest information of the damages at the cultural institutions in Tohoku region, and introduced the activities of Network for Historical Materials, a non-profit network group to support the cultural institutions and individuals to rescue the damaged records by disasters. To respond to my request of providing English information on damaged cultural records by working with the Network for Historical Materials, a couple of individual later expressed their interest and support.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 pm.
