Dear CEAL Members,

On behalf of the Committee on Technical Processing, I am pleased to announce a new cataloging internship program that was created in partnership with the Library of Congress. The LC-CEAL internship program was developed in order to provide training and work experience opportunities to those who may not have access to quality training support in their own institutions. The selected interns will receive substantial training at the Library of Congress from LC's catalogers.

Logistics of the Program:

1. Up to three internship positions are available each year in 2007 and 2008. Each internship will be from 10-15 weeks in duration. The selected intern will directly negotiate training focus, period, duration, etc. with the Library of Congress.
2. The Library of Congress will supply training materials and worksites. All other expenses (travel, lodging, meals, and incidentals) are the responsibility of the intern and/or his/her employer. The Library of Congress might be able to assist the intern to locate housing in the area.
3. CEAL will provide a grant of \$500 to each selected intern.

Procedures:

The application process will be overseen by the members of the Subcommittee on CEAL-LC Cataloging Internship Program: Joy Kim (Chair), Hideyuki Morimoto, and Abraham Yu. The Subcommittee will recommend candidates according to a set of pre-determined selection guidelines, and the Library of Congress will make final decisions. Application deadline is January 19 2007, and the selected interns will be announced before or at the CEAL meeting in March 2007.

Selection Factors:

The Subcommittee members will nominate candidates by considering the following factors.

The candidate:

- ***Is a CEAL member in good standing (i.e. a due-paying AAS member and JEAL subscriber)
- ***Does not have professional colleague(s) knowledgeable in East Asian cataloging issues at his/her own institution, or otherwise lacks training support in-house

- ***Works for a library with fewer than 50,000 CJK titles**
- ***Has less than two years of professional cataloging experience**
- ***Graduated from library school within the past three years**
- ***Has limited language proficiency for the materials s/he catalogs**
