III. CTP Annual Programs

[CEAL Response to CC:DA on ISSN International Centre's Proposal, 6JSC/ISSN/4DP, Submitted to JSC Regarding Major and Minor Title Changes for Serials in Chinese and Japanese]

CTP was contacted by Kathy Glennan, ALA Representative to the Joint Steering Committee to provide feedback to The Proposal in September 2014. CTP came up with a formal response with an input from CEAL membership. ALA endorsed CTP's response and included the CEAL response in ALA's response to JSC in October 1, 2014. In the meantime, LC also submitted a response to JSC. LC Response converted the ISSN Manual amendments into possible revisions of RDA instructions to keep RDA in synch with the ISSN Manual. And it also included some of CEAL's concerns. The JSC response to ISSN International Centre's document was released on November 14, 2014 and the changes are posted in the April 2015 update of RDA toolkit.
