Question 3. From completed pre-session survey form: OCLC fixed some heading control problems for Chinese headings after the new release [of spring 2011]; however, some cases are still problematic. For example, if I want to control a personal name--Feng, Shui, the pop-up screen only gives me the option for "650 Feng shui". This pop-up screen only leads to a subject heading rather than a personal name heading. Quite misleading and confusing!

Answer 3. Headings in WorldCat bibliographic records may be controlled on Connexion Client only when there are corresponding authority records (main headings or subheadings). As of Jan. 9, 2012, there is no personal name authority record for "100 1_ Feng, Shui" in the LC/NACO Authority File, although there is one with date ", ‡d 1962- ". NACO participants are encouraged to contribute authority records, when not yet represented in any form and when feasible without introducing conflicts, to the LC/NACO Authority File.

Question 4. From post-session electronic message: On slide 18, "Calligraphy, Chinese ‡y 20th century ‡x Catalogs" is marked illegitimate (with an asterisk in front of the subject entry). You said it should have " ‡x History" before " ‡y 20th century." I have a different view about this. According to SHM, H1148--Pattern Headings: Art, "20th century" is one of the period subdivisions that can be under the headings for art forms qualified by adjective Chinese. To my understanding, this subject heading is legitimate.

Answer 4. Please see the introductory part of that particular instruction sheet SHM, H1148:

SHM, H 1148, Types of Headings Covered by the Pattern, Sentence 3

The category does <u>not</u> include the heading **Art**, headings qualified by religion, nor headings for the <u>decorative arts</u>, performing arts, or architecture.

Then, according to LCSH for "Calligraphy":

Therefore, as far as *LCSH* is concerned, Calligraphy is now a form of decorative arts, to which the provision at *SHM*, H 1148 is <u>not</u> applied.
