### Background, etc.

- The Control Headings window does <u>not</u> validate the <u>structure</u> of headings.
- When you control headings in bibliographic records, the system does not automatically control and insert a heading when the following is found:
  - An unqualified personal name match (contains only subfield a)
  - No exact match
  - Multiple records that match only partially (OCLC Connexion Client Guides. Authorities: Use Authority Control for Bibliographic Records)

# Scope (modest as introductory webinar)

- Pitfalls of subject headings control functionality inside Connexion Client
  - Some subject entries that control are actually not legitimate
  - Some legitimate subject entries do not control in Connexion Client

On following slides, "\*" in front of subject entries denotes illegitimacy.

"\_" in indicator positions denotes a blank space.

### Not to be Covered

- Controlled subject headings lists other than LCSH, such as ACSH, MeSH, Sears, AAT, etc.
- Semantically inappropriate LCSHs
   assignment to resources on different
   topics and/or discussing topics on
   different levels of specificity

### Not to be Covered--cont.

 Connexion Browser, <u>if</u> there are differences in headings control functionality from Connexion Client

# Controlling vs Legitimacy

- Headings ControlConnexion Client functionality
- Syntactico-Semantico-Pragmatic Legitimacy

mostly from *SHM* provisions; sometimes from *LCSH*s themselves

(semantic legitimacy outside scope of this webinar; focus on syntactic and pragmatic legitimacy)

# Controlling vs Legitimacy--cont.

#### **Situations**

- a. Subject entry legitimate, and controls in Cnx Client
- Subject entry legitimate, but does not control in Cnx Client
- c. Subject entry legitimate, but automatically flipped to and controlled with different entry in Cnx Client

# Controlling vs Legitimacy--cont.

- d. Subject entry illegitimate, but controls in Cnx Client
- e. Subject entry illegitimate, and does not control in Cnx Client
- f. Subject entry illegitimate, then automatically flipped and controlled in Cnx Client
  - i. Flipped to legitimate entry
  - ii. Flipped to another illegitimate entry

### Situation a

Subject entry legitimate, and controls in Cnx Client

```
e.g.,
650 _0 Chinese language *x Errors
of usage *v Dictionaries.
(sh2009119298; sh 99001671)
```

### Situation b

Subject entry legitimate, but does not control in Cnx Client

```
e.g.,
651 _0 Seoul Metropolitan Area (Korea)
(SHM, H 362, 1, bullet 1; SHM, H 790, 1, a;
n 79066627)
```

### Situation c

Subject entry legitimate, but automatically flipped to and controlled with different entry in Cnx Client

Frequently happened until May 2011, but may no longer (or only infrequently) be happening since then. When a corresponding authority record is in error, however, it is carried over to affected controlled entries.

### Situation d

Subject entry illegitimate, but controls in Cnx Client

e.g., *630 00 Trini
```

#### Situation e

Subject entry illegitimate, and does not control in Cnx Client

\*651 \_0 Zhongshan (Kingdom)

(LCCN nr 88002348: 008/15: b; 667: SUBJECT USAGE: This heading is not valid for use as a subject. Works about this place are entered under Ryukyu Islands.)

### Situation f.i

Subject entry illegitimate, then automatically flipped and controlled in Cnx Client--Flipped to legitimate entry

e.g.,

\*610 20 Ihwa Yŏja Taehakkyo ‡x Alumnae ‡z New York County (N.Y.)

610 20 Ihwa Yŏja Taehakkyo ‡x Alumni and alumnae ‡z New York (State) ‡z New York County.

### Situation f.ii

Subject entry illegitimate, then automatically flipped and controlled in Cnx Client--Flipped to another illegitimate entry

```
*650 _0 Authors, Japanese #y 20th century #x Biography #x Last years and death.
```

\*650 \_0 Authors, Japanese ‡y 20th century ‡v Biography ‡x Death and burial.

```
cf. should instead be
650 _0 Authors, Japanese +y 20th century +v Biography.
and/or
650 _0 Authors, Japanese +y 20th century +x Death.
(SHM, H 1155.2; SHM, H 1100; LCCN sh 85009863; LCCN sh 85009868)
```

# Illegitimate but Controlled *LCSH*Entries in WC CJK Records

- Further on situation d: Subject entry illegitimate, but controls in Cnx Client
- Some catalogers: "But, Connexion Client controlled this subject entry. You see the entry is fully underscored in the record."

HM: "Certainly, I see the underscore. However, OCLC admonishes us, 'The Control Headings window does <u>not</u> validate the structure of headings."

Controlled but illegitimate entries involving " \*x Colonies". *E.g.*,

- \*651\_0 Great Britain +x Colonies +z China +z Hong Kong.
- \*651 \_0 Portugal ‡x Colonies ‡z China ‡z Macau (Special Administrative Region) (SHM, H 1149.5)

### Some Other SHM Prohibitions

Controlled but illegitimate entries involving other *SHM* prohibitions. *E.g.*,

- Illegitimate. See SHM, H 2110, 8;
   sh 99014466.
  - --> 650 \_0 Folk drama, Chinese \*x Study and teaching \*z Taiwan \*z I-lan hsien.

- (d) 651 \_0 Korea (South) ‡x Relations ‡z Foreign countries.
- 1. Automatically flipped to: 2 below.
- 2. 651 \_0 Korea (South) ‡x Relations.

  " ‡x Relations" may no longer be subdivided by " ‡z Foreign countries".

  SHM, H 1996, 1 not yet updated; see summary of decisions, PSD editorial meeting (June 9, 2010) and sh 00007590

- (e) 650 \_0 Shin priests #z Japan #v Biography #x Biography #x History and criticism.
- 1. Controls in Connexion Client.
- Illegitimate. See SHM, H 1100.
   --> 650 \_0 Shin priests #z Japan #v Biography.

or

650 \_0 Shin priests #z Japan #x Biography #x History and criticism. [would not control as such, but certainly legitimate]

- (f) 650 \_0 Male domination (Social structure) +x Feminist criticism +z Japan.
- 1. Controls in Connexion Client.
- Illegitimate. See LCCN sh 00005655.
  --> 650 \_0 Male domination (Social structure)[ #z Japan.]
  and
  650 \_0 Feminist criticism[ #z Japan].

When I control the heading, it becomes: 650 0 Chinese fiction. The book is a Chinese novel but not about Chinese fiction. Do we add genre/form headings for literature materials?

#### A1:

- Again, controllability ≠ legitimacy
- Controllability:

```
655 _7 Fiction films. #2 lcgft -->controllable
655 _7 Fiction. #2 lcgft -->uncontrollable
655 _7 Fiction. #2 local -->uncontrollable
655 _0 Fiction. -->uncontrollable
650 _0 Fiction. -->controllable
```

Legitimacy:

```
655_7 Fiction.<u>#2 local</u> -->governed by local cataloging policy
```

#### 655 \_7 Fiction. <u>#2 lcgft</u>

- Literature terms not yet included in LCGFT.
- Use of topical LCSH headings as genre/form terms allowed for those disciplines in which LCGFT authority records not yet made (e.g., literature), if scope note denotes use of hdg. for works of given type. If scope note absent, left to cataloger's judgment. When LCSH used for genre/form entry, should code field 655 with 2nd indicator "0".
- Currently, <u>no</u> provision for <u>language</u> of work within *LCGFT*.
