
- Provide hands-on experience with Korean spatial and numeric data and GIS data



Practices and skills needed to provide expertise in digital scholarship

Librarian as research designer academic producer

providing RESEARCH INFRASTRUCTURE

- Assess the needs and research interests of faculty and students
- Keep up with developments in digital resources (qualitative data, images, texts), tools, and the library's IT infrastructure
- Consider how best to connect users with these resources, tools, and relevant library services
- Collaborate with colleagues across the library such as the Data Curation Librarian, the Data Visualization Librarian, the Digital Scholarship Librarian, Digital Pedagogy Librarian, Research Design Specialist, Copyright Specialist
- Be aware of changes in government policies regarding open access, copyright, etc., not just of the CJK countries but worldwide
