What Roles Will the Cataloging/Metadata Librarians Play for DH/DS Projects?

- Collaboration Makes Global Digital Libraries Sustainable
 - Open access systems vs. silos
 - · Collaboration with diverse stakeholders, esp. for domain-specific knowledge
 - Connect with international frameworks, information hubs, regional centers such as IIIF and DARIAH, etc.
- Quality metadata to enhance the discovery of diverse resources
 - International authority files vs. local authority files
 - Provide quality metadata to expose hidden treasures
 - Follow international standards to make metadata consistent and shareable globally!
- Embracing emerging technology such as linked data
 - Don't Reinvent the Wheel: costly, unstainable and less impactful
 - Use authoritative and linkable thesauri or international authority files such as VIAF, LCSH, LCGFT, LCDGT, AAT, etc.
