Open access e-journals


- The scope: full open access
 - [Diamond or platinum open-access journals](#), which charge no additional publication, open access or article processing fees
 - License agreements for OA resources are complicated.
- Open access digital library collections
 - Provides standardized metadata (PCC Provider Neutral Guidelines)
 - Follows NISO standards such as PIE-J for publishing digitized serials

PIE-J (Recommended Practices for the Presentation and Identification of **E-J**ournals)

- NISO (National Information Standards Organization) best practices
- Key areas:
 - **Titles for Different Formats:** For example, when a journal is available in print and online.
 - **Former Titles:** Information about and easy access to former titles (including ISSN of former titles and the dates that the journal was published under the former titles) needs to be provided on the new title's website to ensure visibility, accessibility, and tracking.
 - **Citations**
 - **ISSN**
- *“Guidance to e-journal publishers and providers that will help ensure that **e-journal content can be reliably discovered, cited, and accessed by users over time**”*
- ISO 8: Presentation and identification of periodicals
 - PIE-J incorporated to ISO 8 on digital periodicals when it was revised and expanded from print serials to all format

DOAJ: CONSER Cooperative Cataloging project

- CONSER database: open metadata
- CONSER authenticated records: quality assurance and ongoing maintenance
- DOAJ includes international resources.
- More CONSER catalogers are involved with editing bibliographic records in the Alma Community Zone
- CONSER records support PIE-J for e-journal publishing guidelines.

DOAJ: CONSER Cooperative Cataloging project (2)

- Usually, ca. 2000 titles per year
- This year:
 - First time: OA collections published by multinational publishers (Elsevier, Emerald, OUP, Sage, Springer, T&F, Wiley, Kluwer) added to DOAJ
 - The titles of languages vary
 - Some languages that have a lot of titles (Indonesian, Portuguese, Polish)
 - Some languages which can only be cataloged by a small number of libraries.

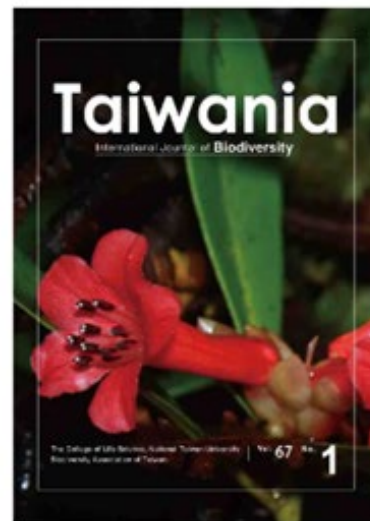

Introduction

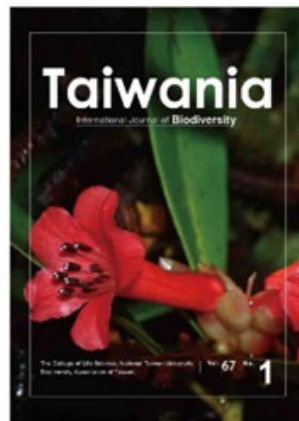
The predecessor of the journal, known as *Acta Botanica Taiwanica* (ISSN:0065-1125), was founded in 1947 by National Taiwan University (NTU). Only one issue was published. In 1948, the name of the journal was changed to *Taiwania*, and published by the Department of Botany, NTU. The Journal was named after the *Taiwania cryptomerioides* Hayata, and originally published English-written papers on plant taxonomy and geobotany devoted to the floras of eastern Asia, Indo-Malaysia and the Western Pacific regions.

Since 1954, *Taiwania* was expanded to cover papers on all aspects of plant science. In 2003, the Departments of Botany and Zoology were integrated into the College of Life Science, and in the next year the journal *Acta zoologica Taiwanica* run by the Departments of Zoology was incorporated into *Taiwania*.

Since then the newly established Institute of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology has been commissioned to manage and publish the Journal, and the Journal has been sponsored and published by the College of Life Science. In response to the changes, the Journal expanded to publish papers on nearly all aspects of biodiversity contributing from all around the world. After over 70 years of publication, the "Taiwania" is now among the oldest English Journal in Taiwan and still in continuous publication. Finally, the Editorial Team gratefully acknowledge financial support from the University. We would also like to thank the Ministry of Science and Technology for extra funding support.

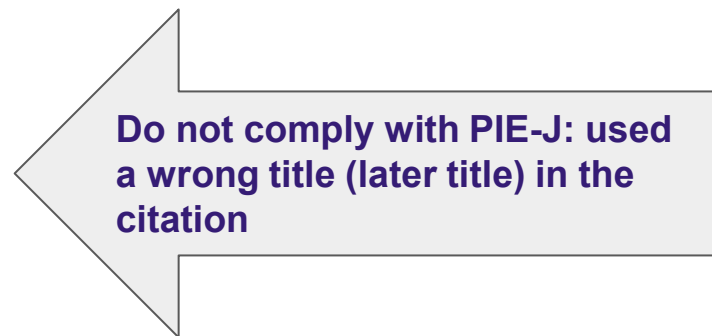

In the course of a longitudinal study of the illness and microbial experience of nursery children in an institution (Junior Village) in Washington, D. C. (1), an outbreak of infection with a previously unrecognized enterovirus (JV-4) was observed. This report will describe some of the characteristics of this virus and the infections which it

Alma Community Zone discussions on CONSERLIST

- Alma Community Zone Management Group
- University of Washington: authenticated 3 e-collections in CZ (with ISSN in brief CZ records): Hein Online, JSTOR, and ScienceDirect during pandemic
- Pros
 - Following the DOAJ cooperative cataloging model, have CONSER members essentially "fill in the gaps" of e-serial collections which lack full-level records in CZ
 - Any KB provider (and ultimately their customers) who use the CONSER file will benefit from this work

Alma Community Zone discussions on CONSERLIST (2)

- Cons
 - Uses ISSN (in either 022 or 776) as the one and only matchpoint for processing of the CONSER file.
 - Loading a newly authenticated print version record if an e-version record does not exist
 - Not replacing a newly authenticated e-version record with an already existing print version CZ record
 - The CZ records are not regularly updated.
